TITLE: Limit to 65 characters

ABSTRACT: Maximum 320 words, including required subheadings, excluding the APA formatted bibliography

SELECTION, ACCEPTANCE, EXHIBIT, and PUBLICATION

Abstracts will be competitively selected for poster presentation on the basis of scholarship, scientific rigor, and relevance to the Institute, Workshop, and Summit theme. Poster judging criteria are available on the website. Presenters will be notified of acceptance by April 16, 2012. Presenters must register and submit registration fee in order to present their poster. A corkboard is provided: 6 ft wide by 4 ft high. Presenters are responsible for setting up and taking down posters at designated times. Accepted poster abstracts will be published on the Institute and ISRN websites and may be entered into the STTI Virginia Henderson International Nursing Library.
